CLINICAL ASPECTS OF ACUTE POST-OPERATIVE PAIN MANAGEMENT ...

Traditionally, acute perioperative pain management has relied solely on opioid medications to target central mechanisms involved in the perception of pain. A better approach uses several agents or techniques, each acting at different sites of the pain pathway, and is known as multimodal analgesia.

Clinical Practice Guidelines for Pain Management in Acute ...

Patients should be educated that post-operative pain is often less than pre-operative pain if

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infection or pulpal inflammation was present. A pain medication that was not effective prior to treatment may be sufficient post-operatively. • Extended-release / long-acting opioid formulations should not be used for acute dental pain.

Recommendations for Management of Acute Dental Pain

The purpose of these Guidelines is to (1) facilitate the safety and effectiveness of acute pain management in the perioperative setting; (2) reduce the risk of adverse outcomes; (3) maintain the patient's functional abilities, as well as physical and psychologic well-being; and (4) enhance the quality of life for patients with acute pain during the perioperative period.

Managing acute postoperative pain is a major challenge for practitioners, given that more than 80% of patients report pain after surgery, and 75% report the pain as moderate, severe, or even extreme. 1-2 In more than half of cases, patients report not receiving adequate pain management following their procedure, 1 which raises concerns over the development of chronic pain down the line.

New Guidelines for Post-Op Pain Management

Introduction. Millions of patients each year suffer from acute pain as a result of trauma, illness, or surgery. Pain is the most common reason for admission to the emergency department (ED), comprising more than 40% of the over 100 million ED visits annually .Furthermore, a large proportion of cases in the ED setting involve pain of moderate to severe intensity .

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Causes and Consequences of Inadequate Management of Acute Pain

Acute medical management of acute aortic syndromes including aortic dissection involves controlling pain, and providing anti-impulse therapy in the form of blood pressure lowering and decreasing the velocity of left ventricular contraction, to decrease aortic shear stress and minimize the tendency for the dissection to propagate .
