Intellectual disability (ID), also known as general learning disability and mental retardation (MR), is a generalized neurodevelopmental disorder characterized by significantly impaired intellectual and adaptive functioning. It is defined by an IQ under 70, in addition to deficits in two or more adaptive behaviors that affect everyday, general living.

Most mentally-ill individuals were placed in institutions. However, the passage of the Social Security Act in 1935 improved the lives of many disabled individuals, by providing a small income and a little self-sufficiency. At the time, institutions were believed to be the best treatment for people with developmental disabilities.

How Were Mentally Challenged People Treated During the 1930s?

Many people with learning disabilities are now becoming parents and yet there are no reliable estimates of numbers due to, first, variations in the definition of learning disabilities over time and cross-nationally (Whitman & Accardo, 1990) and, second, the fact that relatively few parents with learning disabilities are known to the relevant services (McGaw & Sturmeay, 1993).

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Disabled people are sometimes told that they "aren't disabled enough" to need help, and then their needs are ignored. This also happens when they try to advocate for disability rights—they "aren't disabled enough" to understand how "tragic" and "low-functioning" disabled people are. Children with physical disabilities Under the Equality Act, disability includes children who have physical disabilities such as sensory impairments (e.g. affecting sight or hearing) and long-term health conditions such as asthma, diabetes, epilepsy and cancer.. Children and young people with such conditions do not necessarily have additional learning needs, but there is a significant overlap
