Class Schedule

Licensed child day care facilities in California are required to have at least one staff member certified in pediatric first aid, CPR and preventive health practices on duty whenever children are present. School bus drivers in California are required to have basic knowledge of pediatric medical emergencies and to be certified in first aid and CPR.
